Simple yet Unique: The key to Powerful Presentations

Last September, a minor course titled "Storytelling Using Data" by Prof. Mario De Pinto offered a wonderful and insightful experience, introducing specific techniques for impactful presentations. The following tips and tricks are based on valuable experiences and learnings from the course.

Essentials for Powerful Presentations

Be Consistent, Be Simple, Be Clear, Be Specific, and Be Concise.

Whether using Canva, Google Slides, or Microsoft PowerPoint, the following tips can elevate any presentation:

- Font Type, Size, and Color: Don't play around different types of Fonts & the sizes on your slides. Avoid using various font styles and sizes on your slides. Ensure consistency in the title, subtitle, and main content design.
- Mood and Tone of the Slide: Is the presentation for Tiffany & Co.? Ensure the background colors and visual elements are consistent with the brand's identity. Avoid using bold red or funky fonts for a brand like Tiffany & Co.
- Simplicity: A simple design helps the audience retain information more effectively. Aim for a clean and unique look that makes the presentation memorable.
- Clarity: Be clear about the message of each slide. Think about your audience. What are you explaining? Ask yourself first!
- Try to be Specific & Precise. One Impactful statement on the slide provides both clarity & detailed direction. Adding a compelling visual or even a relevant meme can reinforce the message and engage the audience.
- Be Concise: Don't be wordy, visual-overhaul. On a slide, you can just type "I love you", NOT "I am deeply falling in love with you because you are the apple of my eye". audience will not remember long long explanations.
